5. Critical Thinking Across Disciplines: Solves problems with creative/divergent thinking: students will identify a current social issue and design a project to address the issue
6. Communication of professional or scholarly work: students will create a formal written, online portfolio that documents their project. This portfolio will include research about and a description of the issue, a description of the project and the outcome of the project, and a video and/or photo evidence of the steps of the project.
7. Personal growth through leadership and intellectual independence: Students will design and create their own project to address a current social or political issue in the community. This will require students to understand the needs of others in the community before the needs can be addressed.
