ARBC 1030: Arab Cultures

This course discusses the history and culture of the Arab world, examining various aspects of this rich and venerable civilization, the importance attached to education, the achievements of Arab science and also the internal conflicts, wide-spread poverty, and the role of women. This course is also an introduction to how the religion of Islam created a far-flung Arab Muslim world that embraces lands reaching from the shores of the Atlantic to the Indian Ocean, and examines how social institutions and culture are intertwined with politics and economics. This course is taught in English; no previous knowledge of Arabic language is required.

C. OUTLINE OF MAJOR CONTENT AREAS

1. Knowledge and understanding of the history and culture of the Arab world which has been little known and poorly understood in the west will be introduced.
2. The course introduces centuries of Arab cultures and examines all sides of this rich and venerable civilization, the importance attached to education, the achievements of Arab science and also the internal conflicts, wide-spread poverty, and the roles of men and women.
3. This course is an introduction to how Islam created a far-flung Arab-Muslim world that embraces lands reaching from the shores of the Atlantic to the Indian Ocean.
4. This course provides clear and comprehensive interpretations of the paths of the Muslim religion, its divisions, its authority, and traditions, its current contradictory powers to unite and to divide.
5. This course examines how social institutions and culture are intertwined with politics and economics.
