American Musical Theatre is designed to enlighten the learner about the basics of musical theatre production and its genesis as a uniquely American art form. Also, the course will take a close look at the context in which these musicals were created and how they challenged society at that time. In addition, the course will examine the writing of the book, lyrics and music of many shows in an attempt to better analyze and evaluate the content.

C. OUTLINE OF MAJOR CONTENT AREAS

1. The course looks at the American Musical theatre in a historical context as a unique art form derived from existing Western European forms, such as the operettas of Gilbert and Sullivan, as well as a social context, examining the cultural environments that spawn these socially conscious shows.
2. This class may include:
 - a. An overview of basic theatrical practices.
 - b. The study of the form, style and structure of a musical play.
 - c. The examination of race, religion, sexual orientation, family structure, the role of women in society, politics, the counter-culture, drugs, disease and many other socially relevant topics covered in the canon of American Musical Theatre.
 - d. Reading and evaluating the book of several musicals.
